F. B. Kingsley was appointed Superintendent.

Schools have been maintained in all of the districts the same as last year.

It has cost, including estimates for balance of school year, \$2214.43 to run the schools the past year, about 30 per cent of the Grand List, besides the State funds. It will take about 39 per cent besides the State funds to pay up all arrearages.
